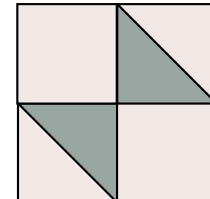
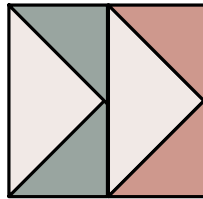
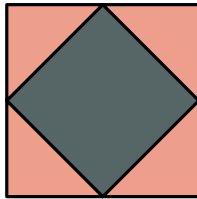
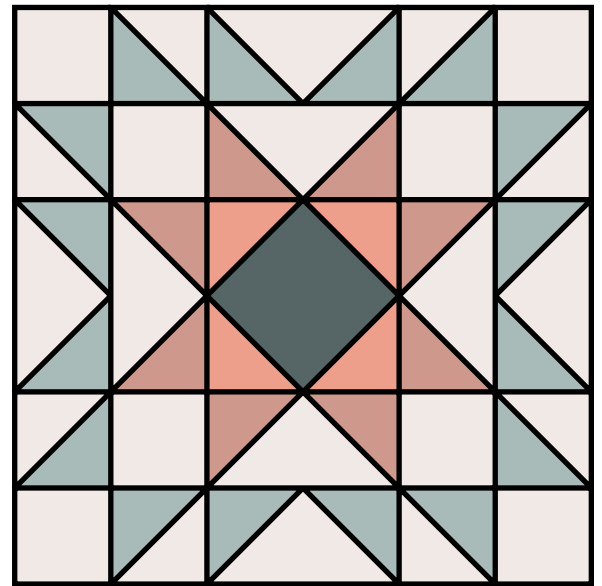


Luminous Quilt Block

12" Block

The Luminous Quilt block is a fun, fresh version of a traditional double star quilt block. Made of three simple blocks: square in a square, flying geese and and hourglass, the seemingly complicated block comes together in no time. 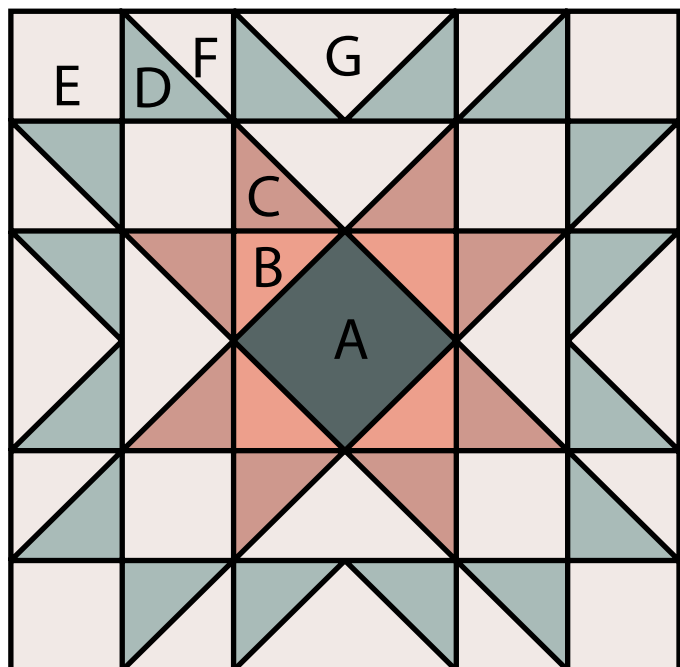
Before Beginning:

- Read all directions before beginning.
- If using directional fabric, more fabric will be required.
- All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless otherwise noted.
- RST=Right Sides Together

Cutting Instructions:

Makes one 12" Block

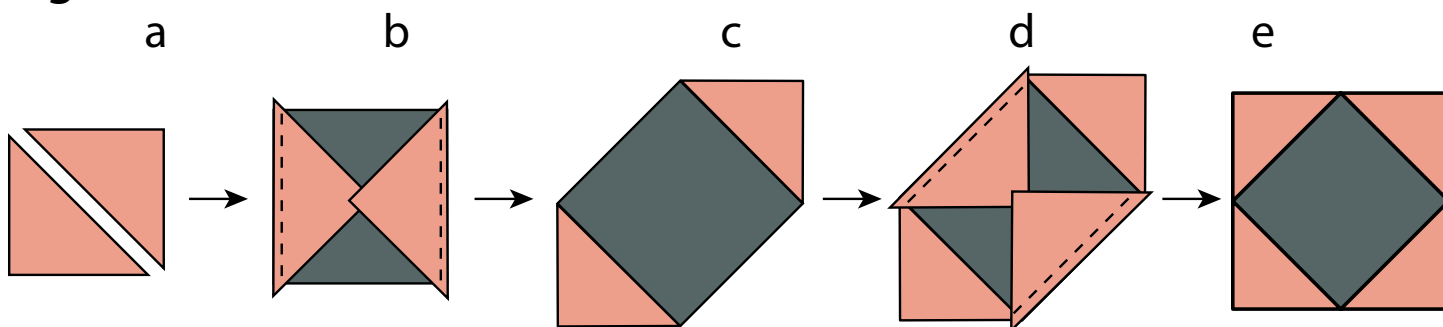
-  Fabric 1
A - (1) $3\frac{3}{8}$ " square
-  Fabric 2
B - (2) 3" squares
-  Fabric 3
C - (4) 3" squares
-  Fabric 4
D - (8) 3" squares
-  Background
E - (8) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
F - (4) 3" squares
G - (2) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares



Square in a Square Block

Make 1 block

Cut the two (B) 3" squares in half on the diagonal to make four half square triangles (Figure 1a).

Place two of the half square triangles RST with the long side of the triangle (hypotenuse) along opposite edges of the (A) 3 3/8" square, sew along the hypotenuse (Figure 1b).

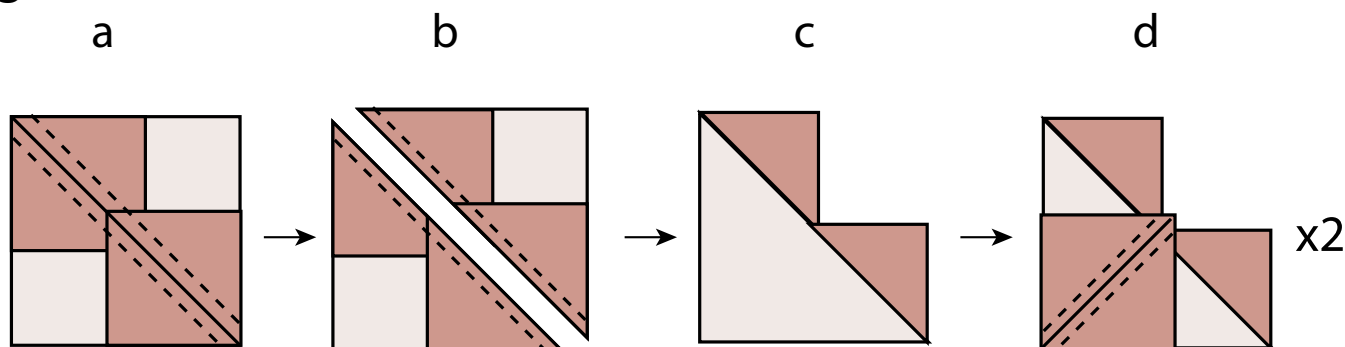
Open the square points and press (Figure 1c). Place the remaining half square triangles along the remaining sides of the 3 3/8" square and sew (Figure 1d).

Press the remaining triangles open (Figure 1e). Trim the finished square in a square to 4 1/2" square.

Flying Geese Block

Make 2 sets - 4 blocks total

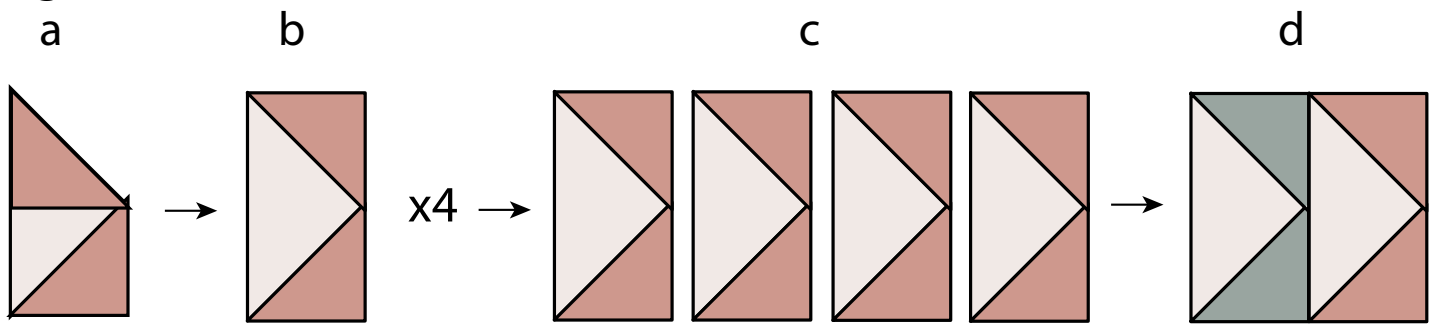
Place two (C) 3" squares RST on top of one (G) 5 1/2" background square in opposite corners, draw a diagonal line across the (C) squares. Then sew 1/4" on either side of the center line, sewing through both (C) squares (Figure 2a). Cut along the center line (Figure 2b).

Note: there will be two identical pieces resulting from the cuts at Figure 2b and Figure 3b. The construction diagrams only show one of these. Repeat the steps with all cuts to make four flying geese blocks.

Fold the points from Figure 2b away from the background and press (Figure 2c).

Place another print square RST with drawn lines in the background corner of the triangles with the diagonal line extending from the corner to between the two print triangles; sew 1/4" from each side of the drawn line (Figure 2d).

Cut along the center drawn line to create two pieces (Figure 3a). Fold the remaining print triangle out to make one Flying Geese block (Figure 2b). Repeat the necessary steps to make four identical blocks (Figure 2c). Trim the Flying Geese units to $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$.

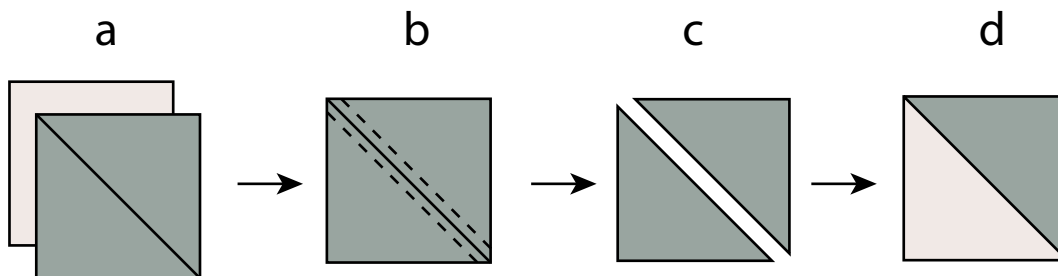
Repeat with the remaining (G) $5\frac{1}{2}''$ square and four (D) $3''$ background squares for a total of eight flying geese blocks. Trim all the Flying Geese blocks to $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$.

Sew the geese into sets of one block with C corners and one block with D corners (Figure 3d). Make 4 blocks.

Hourglass Block

Make 4 blocks

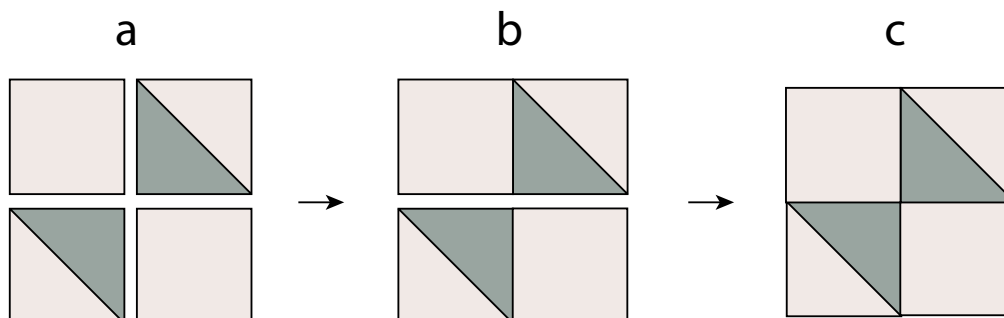

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the four (D) $3''$ squares. Place one (D) square RST with one (F) $3''$ square (Figure 4a). Sew $\frac{1}{4}''$ on either side of the drawn line (Figure 4b).

Cut along the drawn lines to make two sets (Figure 4c). Press the the half square triangles (HST) open (Figure 4d). Repeat to make 8 half square triangle blocks. Trim all the HSTs to $2\frac{1}{2}''$

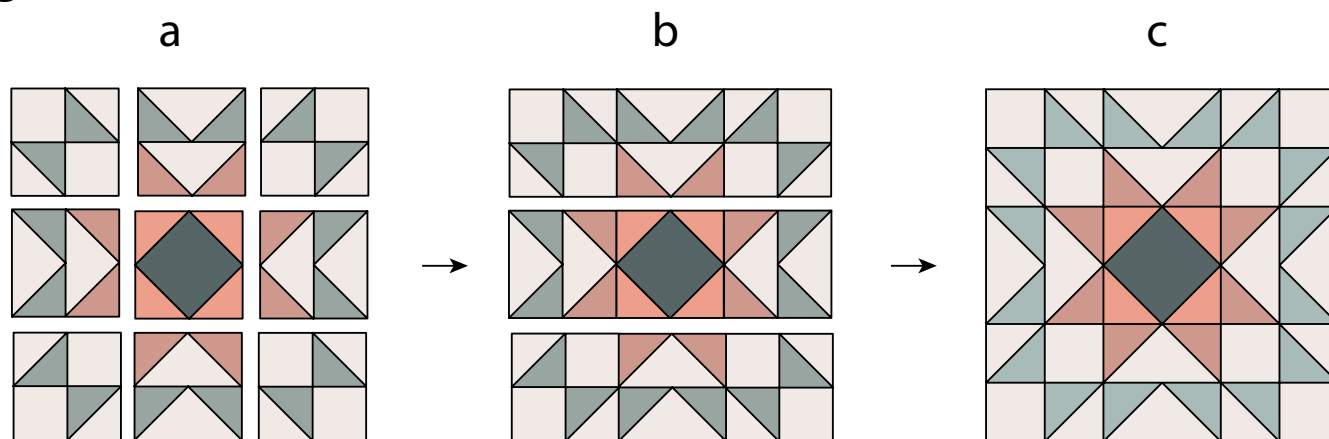


Use two (E) squares and two HSTs (Figure 5a). Sew one (E) $2\frac{1}{2}''$ square and one HST together with the Fabric 3 print at the seam (Figure 5b). Repeat with all (E) squares and HSTs. Sew into pairs to form an hourglass (Figure 5c). Finished blocks measure $4\frac{1}{2}''$ square. Make 4 blocks.

Assemble Quilt Block

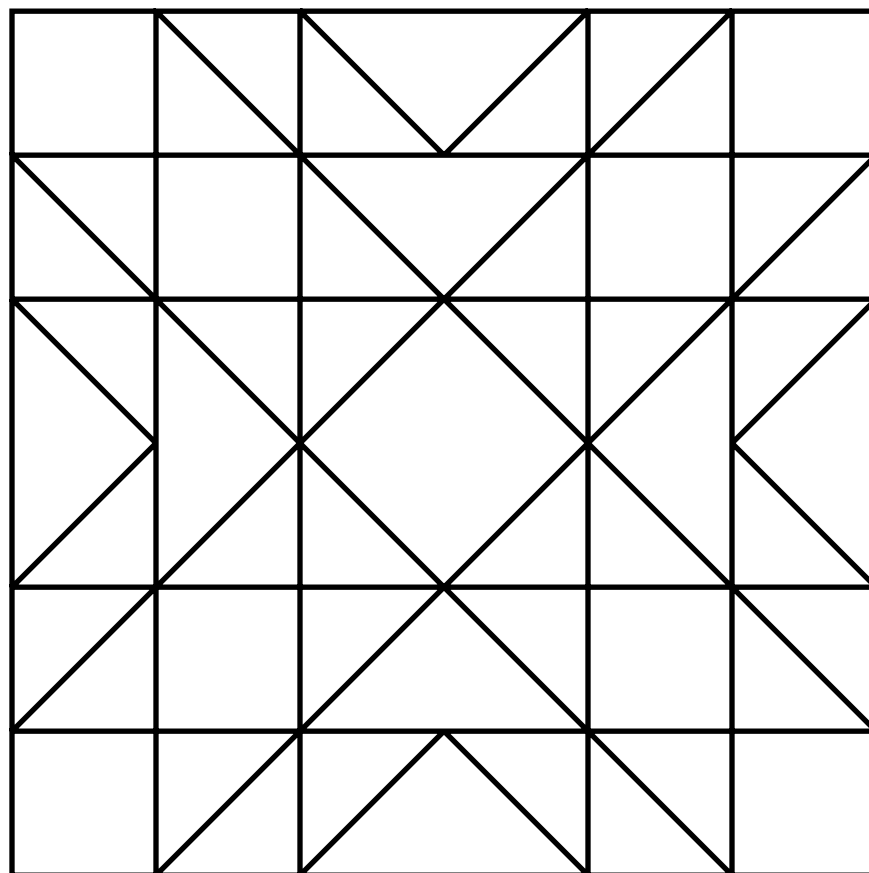
Make 1 - 12" Block

Arrange block as shown in Figure 6a. Sew the block together in three rows (Figure 6b). Sew the rows together to complete you block (Figure 6c).
